Student and Family Affordability Fund

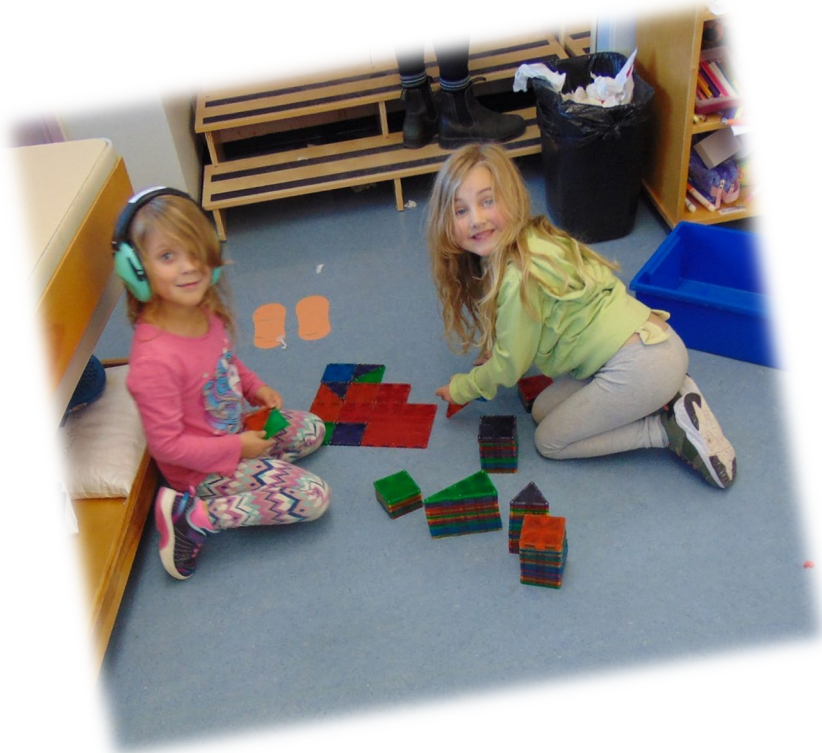
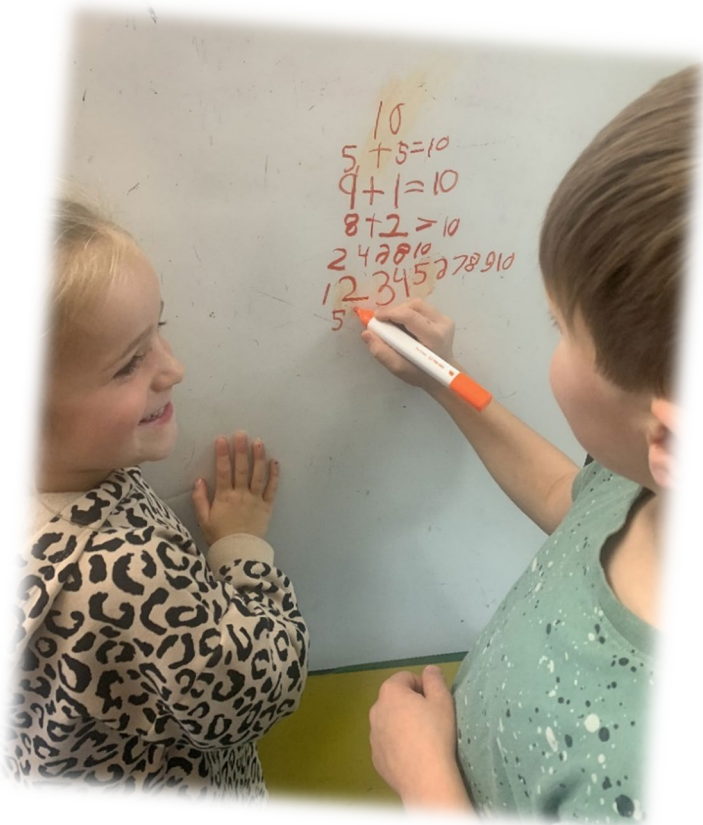

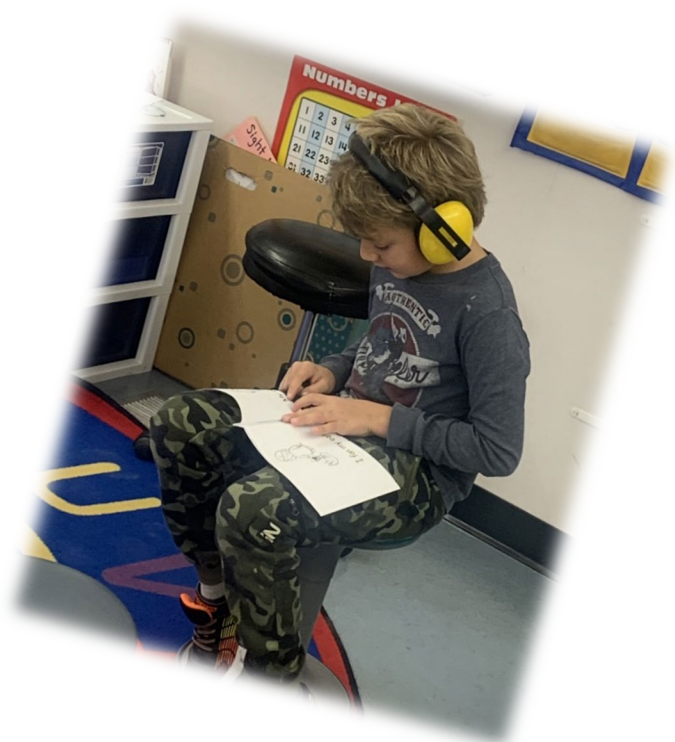


DO YOU KNOW?
